WHAT DOES EACH PRODUCTION SYSTEM MEAN?

BARN

Hens are housed in buildings with one or more levels. The hens have space to move around freely, litter for dust-bathing and scratching, and are provided with nest boxes and perches.

FREE-RANGE

Free range bird houses are similar to the barn systems with nest boxes, perches and scratching areas being provided and room to move around freely. The birds also have access to the outdoors during daylight hours.

ORGANIC

Organic birds free-range on organically farmed land and are kept in smaller flocks with plenty of space for nest boxes, perches and scratch areas. They are fed on an organically produced diet.

ENRICHED COLONY CAGE

Enriched colony cage systems hold between 40 and 80 birds. They help to promote a bird's natural behaviour by providing a nest box, scratching area, perches and more space to move around and flap their wings etc.

YOUR GUIDE TO BUYING BRITISH EGGS

This leaflet outlines different egg production systems, and explains what to look out for when buying eggs



EGG LABELLING

- If you buy eggs direct from the farmgate for your own consumption they do not need to be stamped.
- The Farm ID number on an egg is unique to each farm so eggs can be traced back to the farm where they have been produced.
- Eggs that are stamped have been graded for size and carry the information outlined opposite.
- British eggs will be stamped with the UK sign to show they were produced here

more than 350 laying hens test their flocks for salmonella. The most recent NCP results show UK prevalence levels are extremely low at 0.25% for Salmonella Enteritidis and Salmonella Typhimurium. The majority of UK hens are vaccinated against Salmonella.
